Abstract: This first colloquium of the semester is related to the Math 203 (CAMCOS) class offered in Fall 2015. This semester's projects will be selected from www.kaggle.com, which is a platform hosting many data science competitions. This talk serves as a basic introduction to the Kaggle competitions as well as to the necessary background for working on the projects. The colloquium assumes no prior knowledge and everyone (including both CAMCOS applicants and those who want to learn more about the course) is welcome.

Background: No particular background is necessary.
